September is upon us; fall is waiting in the wings. I love this time of year, even as I am sad that summer is coming to a close. There is such a sense of possibility, a sense of beginning again each September. This is true in our beloved SouthWest Church community as well. On the 10th we have our annual Ingathering, when we come together to re-commit to our congregation and to the year ahead- to walk with each other through one more cycle in the circle of life.

This month our theme is Circle of Life and your Worship Team asks each of you to bring an image of your ‘family’, whatever that means to you, for us to create our own visual Circle of Life including all our generations and iterations of family. So whether that’s your birth family, your own family, your pets, or your chosen family, bring a picture or image to share for the month. Ask yourself, “what moves me about the circle of life?” Is it life/death, regeneration, the seasons of nature, prayer or medicine wheels – ponder, talk with a friend, journal and come to church as we explore this month. We will be starting Covenant Groups again in October, so make space in your calendar.

In the UUA’s Touchstones Journal, Kirk Copeland writes that the Rev. Forrest Church often said, “Religion is the human response to being alive and having to die.” This places the circle of life at the center of our religious concern. Our seventh principle and sixth source reinforce the importance of the circle of life, both literally and metaphorically, as does the turning of the year, and the passing of the seasons.

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Board Happenings

Greetings from your Board of Trustees! We hope everyone's fall is off to a great start. Ours certainly is. Here is a quick summary of our activities in August. We had our first full meeting of the new board on August 15th. Board members are Dan Paxson, Sherry Spencer, Bruce Cady, Katie Maslar, Dave Chesnes, Hallie Davis, and Phyllis Hall. Details of the meeting are available in the form of our minutes which anyone can request by contacting me at me. Major topics covered included the status of our Endowment Fund and Policy (stay tuned for more on this in coming months), funding and timing for the repair and re-siding of our steeple, and planning for our retreat. In an effort to bring more of a sprit of fun to this event, we decided to hold it in Hawaii...Bah Ha Ha!

The retreat was actually held at church on August 19th, from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm. We spent some time getting to know one another's leadership style by reviewing a personality profile that we had each filled out ahead of time. It goes by the acronym DISC (I'll leave it to you to Google it). Some of us were a bit surprised by where we ended up in its spectrum of styles. All of us learned something valuable about each other. It was time well spent.

We next established a covenant for ourselves. It is longer than you may want to read in a newsletter, but essentially boils down to: show up, engage, respect, come together, stay light, and follow through. As you may know, we take our covenants pretty seriously at SWUU, so we will revisit and recommit to this one often throughout the year.

The remainder of the retreat was focused on goal setting. When the dust finally settled, we had 3 aspirational goals, 2 concrete goals, and 2 follow-up goals (continuations from last year). They are:

Aspirational

- Follow through on outcomes of the Long Range Planning Workshop
- Lead the congregation in engaging with dismantling racism in ourselves, our organization and our world
- Ensure that leadership is transparent, visible and engaging, while communicating and developing leadership channels

Concrete


- Develop Safety & Emergency Preparedness policies & procedures
- Explore the possibility of having a professional bookkeeper or accountant instead of our current volunteer system to handle critical aspects of our finances

Follow-up

- Complete/approve Endowment Fund Policy, establish Endowment Committee, publicize Fund to congregation
- Decide and move on repairing the steeple & upgrading the sound system

We're pretty excited by these. I'll have more to tell you about them, and about our progress in implementing them in the coming months.


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Coming in October: SWUU Community "Connection" Fest! by Sherry Spencer, Board of Trustees

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Sharing and Caring


