On October 18, many of us were out in the streets for the No Kings protests, raising our voices for our UU values of Love, Justice, Equity, Transformation, Pluralism, Interdependence, and Generosity. It was good to be together, even as we were spread out across different cities and towns.

While I was there at one of the protests, I received a wonderful text. It was a picture of one of our congregation's children, Blake, holding a sign that said "THANK YOU!!!" in big bold letters. Next to it, she wrote "You are amazing!!!" and underneath, she added "I LOVE SWUU!!!"

Blake's mom, Kristen, explained that they were driving through a couple of the protests to show their support. Blake wanted her sign to include "I love SWUU" because she knew that her SWUU family would be among the protestors.

Beloveds, it is often so easy to feel overwhelmed by the bigness of things, asking, 'Do the things we do really make a difference?'

Blake's enthusiastic display of gratitude reminded me that they do. And while our hearts are trained on the big picture of liberation and building a better world, our children are watching. They see who we are, they see what we do. They see it while we are all gathered together in the sanctuary and they see it when we are out in the world. They are watching. And that is no small thing.



May we remember that. May we know how powerful that is. And may that knowing feed our commitment and our hope.


Sharing and Caring
